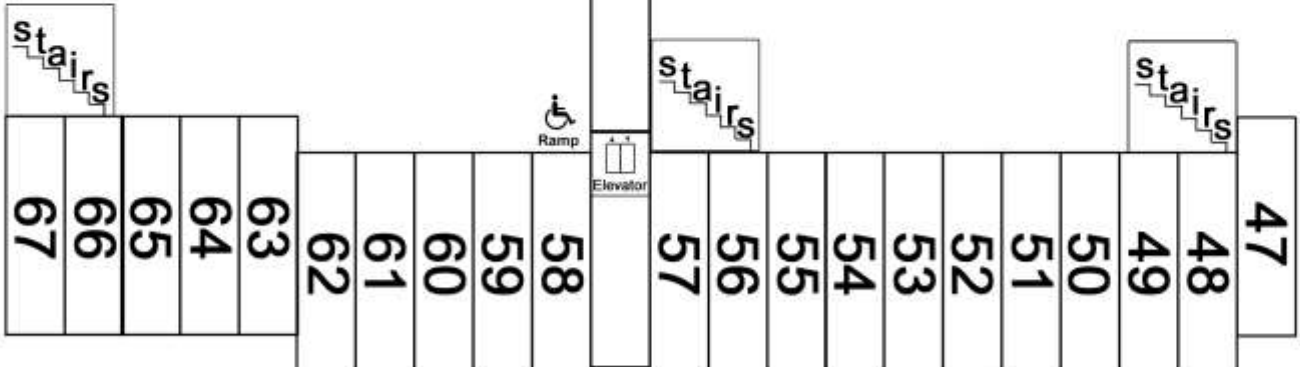

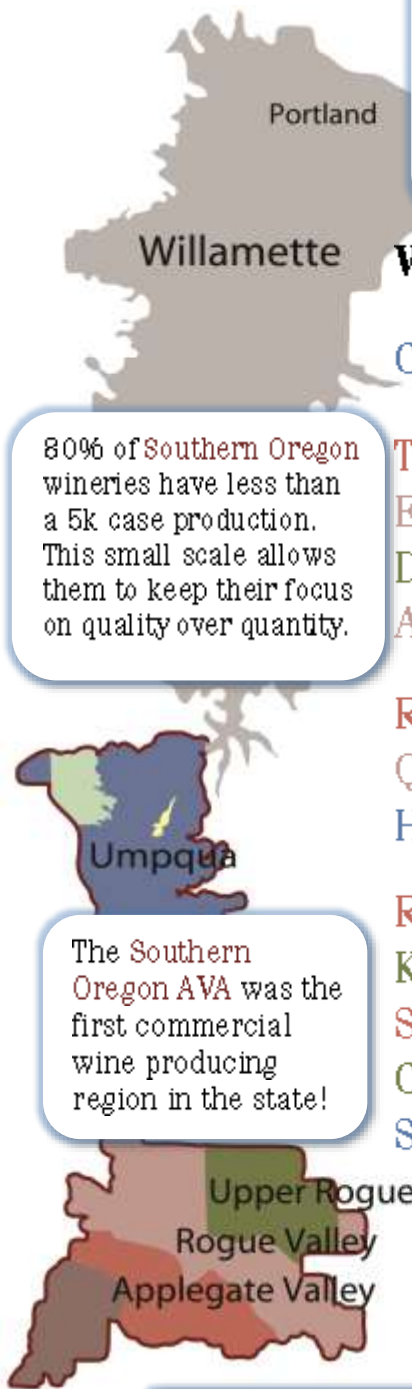

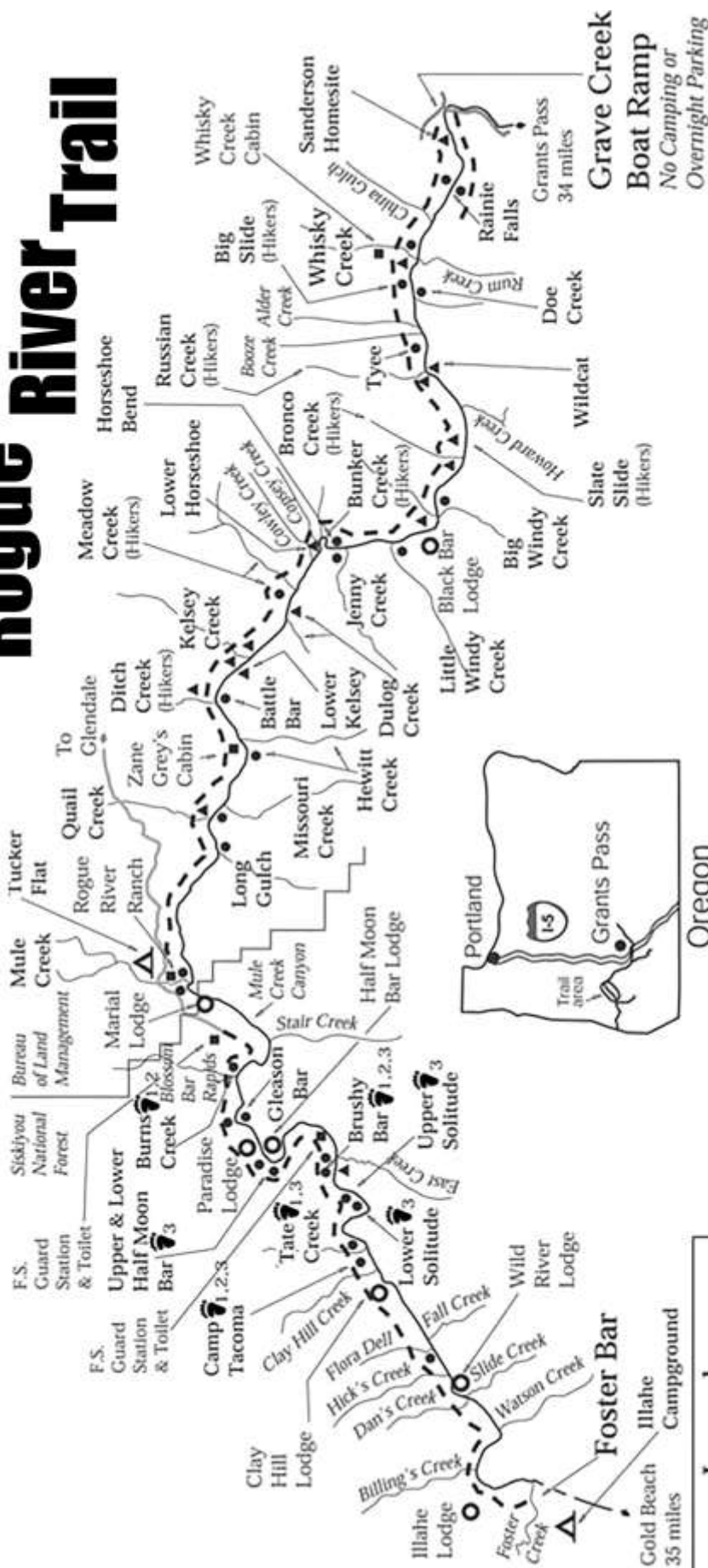


Our seasonal swimming pool is located adjacent to the lobby. Towels are available poolside.

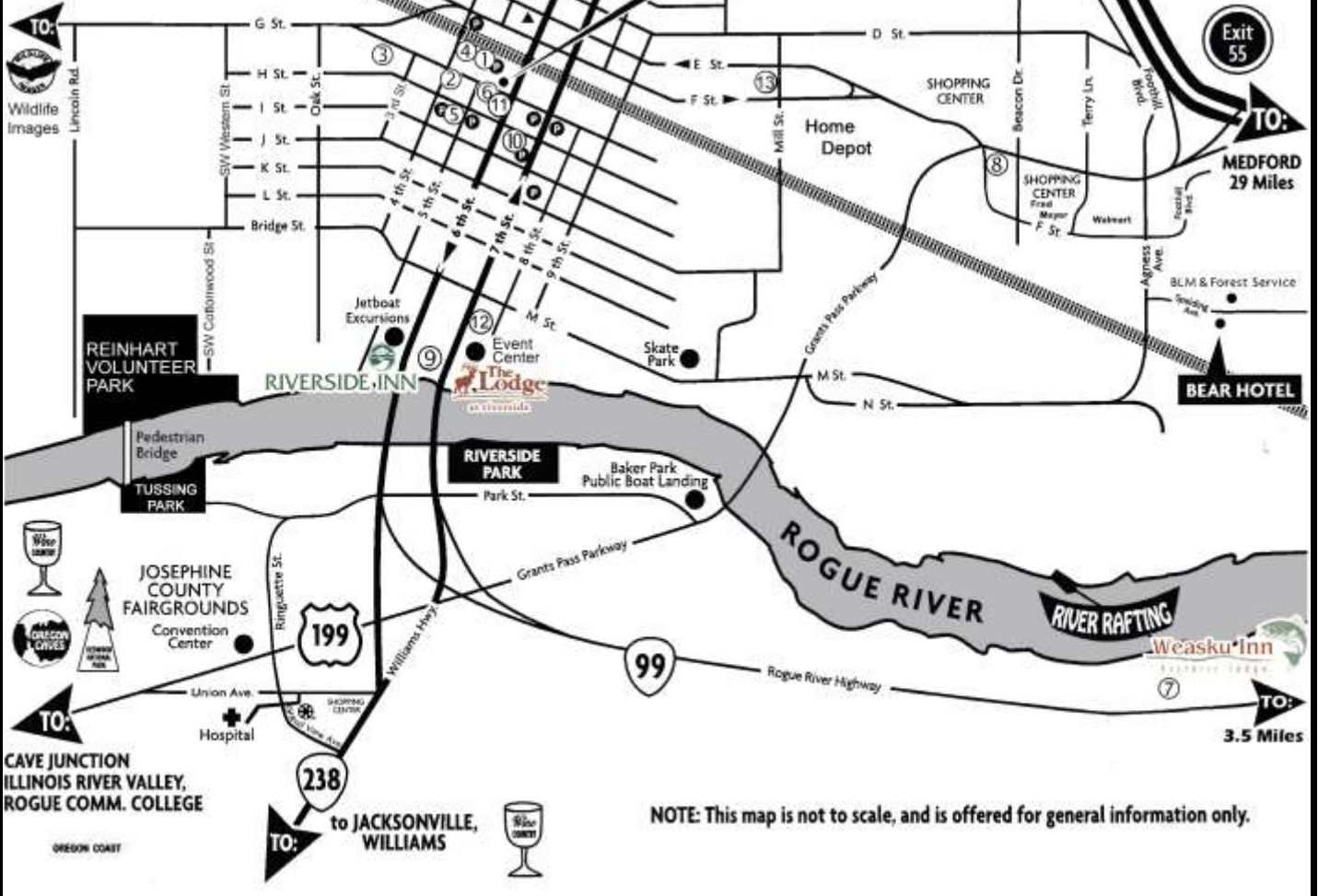

A Little Bit of Grants Pass

History



RIVERSIDE INN

The name “Grants Pass” was selected to honor General U.S. Grant’s success at Vicksburg in 1863, but the rich history of the area goes back much further than that.

Grants Pass is located in Josephine County, the only county in the state of Oregon named in honor of a woman. Josephine Rollins who was the first white woman to settle in this part of Oregon. In 1850, Josephine and her father, Lloyd Rollins, became members of an emigrant train heading west. The train reached Oregon City in October. The following spring, Josephine accompanied her father and a party of miners south to the Rogue River. Guided by Native Americans, the party made its way to a creek within a few miles of the present Illinois River. The creek marks the location of the first gold strike in Southern Oregon, and it is still called Josephine Creek.

In 1852, sailors who had deserted their ship near Crescent City started for the newly discovered gold fields at Jacksonville, but found rich deposits at a location in the Illinois Valley some 25 miles south of **present Grants Pass. This discovery at “Sailor Diggin’s” immediately became an important mining center** with a population of several thousand. The name was later changed to Waldo in honor of William Waldo, brother of Daniel Waldo a prominent figure in early Oregon history. In 1858, many miners left for new discoveries on the Frazier River of British Columbia — never to return again.

Sailor Diggin’s had been designated as the first county seat, “until a permanent location was established” by a vote of the people. On July 7, 1857, Kerbyville was selected to serve as the seat of government for Josephine County. In 1885, voters cast a majority of their votes for Grants Pass as a **“permanent location” for the county government.**

The Native Americans who lived along the Rogue River have often been termed “fierce”. There were a number of linguistic groups comprising these tribes, frequently referred to as “The Rogues” because of their willingness to fight for their rights. The tribal classifications were Takelma and Shasta. After the final war of 1856, the Native Americans were moved to the Siletz and Grand Ronde Reservations on the Northern Oregon Coast.

The Applegate wagon train of emigrants in 1846 made the first wagon tracks through the beautiful Rogue River Valley. The emigrants of that time had but one destination in mind, the Willamette Valley, and they failed to note the spectacular beauty which would one day provide Oregon with one of its greatest tourist attractions. The trail followed by the Applegate party was on the south side of the Rogue River and crossed at Fort Vannoy about five miles west of present Grants Pass.

Grants Pass served as a stagecoach stop in the 1860s and became a railhead with the completion of the California/Oregon railroad (now the Union Pacific) in 1884.

The railroad line was completed to Grants Pass on Christmas Eve, 1883. The rapid population growth in the county brought tradesmen of many types, including miners, farmers, lumbermen and orchardists. Grants Pass became the trading center of the county.

The Rogue River: One of the nation's famous "Wild and Scenic" rivers provides trophy sized fish for anglers, jet boating, kayaking, gold panning, or just relaxing and enjoying the rugged beauty and abundant wildlife. Experienced river outfitters serve as guides for fishermen and rafters.

Schmidt House Museum: Located at 512 SW 5th Street in Grants Pass, this historic house is open to the public Tuesday-Friday 10:00 am to 4:00 pm.

Riverside Park: The pride and joy of Grants Pass, this park features frontage on the Rogue River, a playground, rose garden, large mature trees, a softball field, a soccer field, and lots of grass for picnics and play. A disc golf course wanders through sections of the park and is another popular feature. During the summer months the park is the home of the Concerts in the Park series.

Sportsman Park: A unique park built specifically for gun enthusiasts. It has seven different gun ranges and there are areas for archery and hatchet throwing. Sportsman Park is located at 7407 Highland Avenue.

Indian Mary Park: A beautiful park situated on the banks of the Rogue River, near Galice. In addition to 89 campsites, there are hiking areas, a boat ramp, a sandy beach area, athletic fields, picnic sites, and a playground.

Lake Selmac: This lake is a 148 acre reservoir that sits in a 500 acre county park. It is only a 25 minute drive from Grants Pass on the Redwood Highway. You can camp, swim, fish, sail, picnic, or just kick back and enjoy the scenery.

Redwood Highway: This highway connects Grants Pass and the spectacular Oregon Coast. It is 85 miles of breathtaking scenery through awe-inspiring redwood forests, the rugged Smith River Canyon and the beautiful Illinois Valley.

Crater Lake National Park: Located 97 miles east of Grants Pass, this is one of the most beautiful places on earth. It is the deepest lake in the United States and Oregon's only National Park. The beauty of this amazingly beautiful blue lake is an unforgettable sight.

The Oregon Caves National Monument: Located high in the Siskiyou Mountains east of Cave Junction. In addition to cave tours, there is also a rustic chateau with a dining facility. The drive to the monument is beautiful and filled with wildlife.

Kerbyville Museum: Equipment and exhibits that represent a century of gold and mineral mining. Located in Kerby, about 25 miles from Grants Pass on Redwood Highway.

Wolf Creek Tavern: This historic roadside inn of the early 1800's is located 22 miles north of Grants Pass. It was an original stagecoach stop and is listed in the National Register of Historic Places.

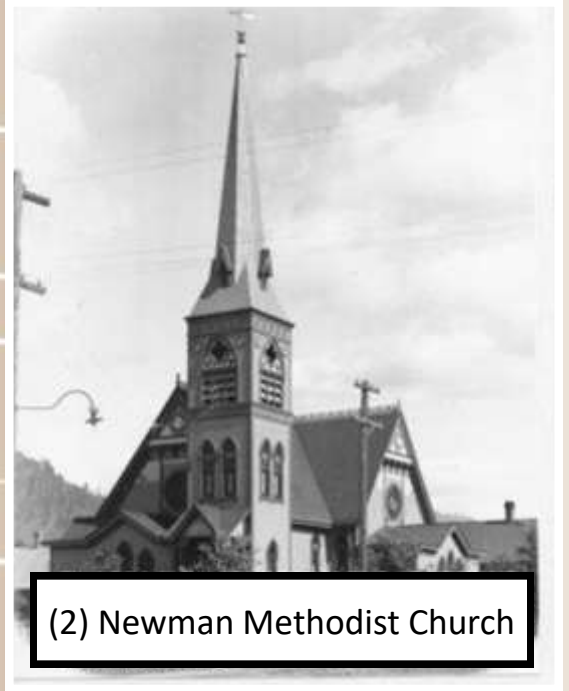
Schroeder Park: This park is located on Schroeder Lane off Redwood Avenue in Grants Pass. It has 31 campsites and areas for picnics and swimming, there is also a boat ramp.

Hellgate Canyon: Located 10 miles from Grants Pass on the Merlin-Galice road. There is a scenic viewpoint that overlooks the 250 foot canyon and the Rogue River. Don't forget your camera!

- *1) **George Calhoun House... 1910**
612 N.W. 5th Street — Bungalow style home characterized by wide porch, deep eave overhangs with exposed rafters.
- 2) **Newman Methodist Church... 1890**
6th & “B” Street — Oldest church building in town
- *3) **Flanagan House... 1905**
720 N.W. 6th Street — Eclectic style house combines elements of Queen Anne and Colonial Revival styles.
- *4) **Ahlf House... 1902**
762 N.W. 6th Street — Queen Anne style. Largest historic residence in Grants Pass, with 5,000 square feet.
- 5) **Dayton-Dixon House... 1903**
1006 Conklin Street— Originally located next to the Flanagan House. It was moved in 1980 to present site and restored.
- *6) **R.L. Coe House... 1885**
1002 N.W. Washington Street — Eastlake style house as characterized by the porch, gable ends and one over one windows.
- 7) **Sutton House... 1905**
750 N.W. 4th Street — Originally Queen Anne style until a tower was removed from the S.E. corner of the house.
- 8) **L.B. Hall House... 1907**
751 N.W. 4th Street — Colonial Revival style with characteristic low-pitched hip roof, one over one double windows.
- *9) **McLean House... 1890**
724 N.W. 4th Street — Shiplap exterior has “stick” decorative elements, gable roof, brick chimney with corbeled top.
- 10) **Cramer House... 1898**
716 N.W. 4th Street — Eastlake style wood trim work in the gable ends. One over one double hung sash windows.
- *11) **Michael Clemens House... 1905**
612 N.W. 3rd Street — Shingle style house designed by Frank Clark. Gardens planted by Mrs. Clemens.
- 12) **St. Luke’s Episcopal Church... 1895**
224 N.W. “D” Street — One of the early Grants Pass Churches. Steeply pitched and gabled roof, wood frame construction.

Commercial Tour

- 13) **Albert Building... 1909**
220 N.W. 6th Street — Modified Italianate style.
- 14) **First National Bank of Oregon Building... 1890**
208 N.W. 6th Street — One of the oldest commercial buildings in town. Romanesque Style. Originally had clock tower.
- 15) **Climate Sign... 1976**
Spans 6th St. North of G Street — First sign was wood and said “Finest Climate.” Present sign was erected as part of Bi-Centennial celebration.
- 16) **“G” Street Historic District located between 4th and 6th Streets**
The first street in town, originally called Front Street. Buildings are brick since original wood buildings were destroyed by two fires around the turn of the century. Cobblestones are under the present street.
- 17) **Kienlen-Harbeck Building... 1900**
147 S.W. “G” Street — The turret is characteristic of the Romanesque style as are the carved designs on the capitals.
- 18) **Palace Hotel... 1900**
201 S.W. “G” Street — Although the building has been altered, evidence of it’s original Romanesque style is evident in the flat roof and arched and flat-topped openings.
- 19) **Kesterson Building... 1910**
229 S.W. “G” Street — Notice interesting brick work along roof line. Although there has been much alteration, characteristics of the Italianate style can still be seen.
- 20) **Old City Hall... 1912**
214 S.W. 4th Street — Designed by Ashland architect W.F. Bowen. Detailing reminiscent of American Renaissance style. The white brick came from Yamhill County.
- 21) **Rogue River Brewing Company... 1886**
509 S.W. “G” Street — Originally a brewery until county was voted dry in 1907. Somewhat altered it still retains Italianate characteristics. It is now the home of Climate City Brewing Company.
- *22) **Smith-Carnahan House... 1902**
139 S.W. “I” Street — Paired Gables of the façade are characteristics of English Arts and Crafts style. Private residence which has been in the same family for four generations.
- 23) **Schmidt House... 1902**
508 S.W. 5th Street — Brick laying style is very rare and is called “All Rolok.” Houses the Josephine County Historical Society Library. This building is open to the public as a museum with tours.

Enjoy The Legendary Rogue River

One of Southern Oregon's most famous attractions is the fabled and wildly beautiful Rogue River.

Starting high in the Cascade Mountains, the Rogue River plunges 215 miles on its journey to the sea. You can enjoy it as a tumbling mountain stream, a quiet flowing river deepening into pensive pools, or as crashing white-water rapids.

Zane Grey, writing from his one-room log cabin on the Rogue in 1920, wrote this description in his book *Rogue River Feud*:

“Deep and dark green, swift and clear, and pure as the snow from which it springs, the river has its source in the mountains under Crater Lake. It is a river at its birth, gliding away through the Oregon forest with hurrying momentum, as if eager to begin the long leap down through the Siskiyou. The river tumbles off the mountain in mellow thundering music, racing between its timbered banks down the miles to the sheltered valley. Twisting through Grants Pass, it chafes and fights its way, rushing over the rocks until finally, it enters the canyoned wilderness of the Coast Range.”

In the 1970s the Rogue was designated by Congress as a “Wild and Scenic” river. What this means to the visitor today is access to an unspoiled and beautiful wilderness.

Wildlife abounds along the Rogue. You may see bear, raccoons, deer, hawks, eagles, blue herons, osprey, turtles, otter, beaver, elk, coyotes, and occasionally, a cougar or bobcat.

The river runs of steelhead and salmon are legendary, but there is good rainbow trout fishing as well. You can fish by yourself along the bank or arrange for a guide and boat.

The Rogue also has a well-deserved reputation as a classic river run. Many white-water boaters confront its challenging rapids. Experienced river outfitters and jet-boaters serve as guides to fisherman and rafters alike. The river is diverse enough to provide the level of excitement you seek, whether it be a relaxing float or a heart pounding white-water adventure.

MERLIN & GALICE

The Natural Gateway to the Wild and Scenic Rogue River.

This area is filled with history. One of the first pioneer families to settle here in 1850 were the Haines, who were massacred in the Rogue Indian War of 1855. The site of their homestead is close to where the famous Applegate Trail passes. The trail came over Mt. Sexton from Sunny Valley, down what is now Pleasant Valley Road and Pottsville past the Haines' family homestead, then the mill and on to Fort Vanoy on the Rogue River.

After the Rogue Indian Wars, the area remained unsettled until the Southern Pacific Railroad established the Jump Off Joe Station in the early 1880s.

In early 1885, clearing began of the site considered Merlin Proper today. The name Merlin came from a railroad employee named David Loring, after seeing the area inhabited by pigeon hawks, also know as Merlins. The Merlin-Galice stage delivered both mail and passengers daily making noon and afternoon stops at **Indian Mary's Ranch (now a park) for horse changes** as it made a round trip from Merlin to Galice.

Among those etching their spots in local history from 1886 to 1903 was a rare woman homesteader, Mary Tyler. Her 1891 deed and property known today as the

Doubletree Ranch still remains in her family's hands. Umpqua Joe, Indian Mary's father, ferried miners, lumbermen, carpetbaggers, orchard wagons and homesteaders. Over one-half million dollars worth of gold came out of our valley in 1902 alone!

In 1914, an egg shaped 11.5 pound brick of pure gold was found a mile and a half below Galice. In 1915, pioneer white-water guide and boat builder Glen Wooldridge made his first boat trip down the Rogue River. He is said to be the first to navigate the entire river from Grants Pass to Gold Beach.

The major building boom ended on October 24, 1915, when fire ravaged an entire block in Merlin, destroying the Southern Pacific Railroad Depot, the post office, blacksmith shop, general store, and some new homes. Most of Merlin's documented history was destroyed in that fire and its growth stunted when the train activity was transferred to Grants Pass. Even after rebuilding, the area was not quite the same.

In the mid-1920s, Zane Grey built his cabin below Galice and Merlin built a community hall. The hall is fondly remembered as the center for pie and box socials, dances and lots of fun.

Today, Merlin is enjoying a period of prosperity as newcomers to our area settle here to raise families and

Fish for that trophy catch from your boat or the bank, but stop first at one of the tackle shops for the latest river and fish-run information and to buy fresh bait and your license and tags. Several rafting/fishing businesses offer safe and fun ways to travel the river.

Depending on your desired style of adventure, you can just sit comfortably in a boat or raft and listen to the oars skim the water while your guide points out the highlights. You can also paddle a one or two-seater or handle an oar on a six-person team.

Be sure to visit the Merlin Community Park located right in town. It offers a quiet spot to picnic or just relax. There is a small playground, picnic and barbecue areas, horse shoe pits, restroom facilities, and the Veterans Walk of Honor.

Pottsville is an interesting place to visit. This simulated old western town north of Merlin, includes a general store, blacksmith shop and hotel, with old-time farm equipment and mining and lumber vehicles, plus a stagecoach and other equipment of an earlier era. It is open to the public **on Father's Day weekend each year; otherwise available for drive-by viewing.**

Experience the scenic rural and river areas in your car, recreational vehicle, bicycle or in a chartered bus. Stop by viewpoints as you travel to camp, hike or play at one of our nine county parks. Golf, wine, dine and dance, pan for gold, hound for rocks, or just relax on a secluded section of the Rogue River under the shade of giant trees.
